

THE CONSTITUTION OF INDIA



PREAMBLE

We the people of India, HAVING SOLEMNLY RESOLVED TO CONSTITUTE INDIA INTO A SOVEREIGN SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC and to secure to all its citizens:

JUSTICE, social , economic and political;

LIBERTY of thought , expression, belief , faith and worship;

EQUALITY of status and of opportunity;

and to promote among them all ;

FRATERNITY assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation ;

IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this twenty – sixth day of November, 1949 do HEREBY ADOPT, ENACT AND GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.

The Constitution of India

Chapter IVA

Fundamental Duties

ARTICLE 51A

Fundamental Duties:

It shall be the duty of every citizen of India-

- (a) To abide by the Constitution and respect its ideals and institutions, respect the National Flag and the National Anthem.
- (b) To cherish and follow the noble ideals which inspired our national struggle for the freedom.
- (c) To uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India.
- (d) To defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so.
- (e) To promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities; to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women.
- (f) To value and preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture.
- (g) To protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers, wild life and to have compassion for living creatures.
- (h) To develop the scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform.
- (i) To safeguard public property and to adjure violence.
- (j) To strive towards excellence in all spheres of individuals and collective activity so that the nation constantly rises to higher level of endeavour and achievement.
- (k) Who is a parent or guardian, to provide opportunities for education to his child, or as the case may be, ward between the age of six to fourteen years.

1. ABOUT THE SCHOOL

The N.I.T.K. English Medium High School (formerly called as KREC English Medium High School) was established in the year 1968 with the objective of meeting the needs of an English Medium School for the children of the employees in the NITK campus who hail from different linguistic parts of the country. The school is open to the members of the public also.

Since then the School has developed by leaps and bounds. The School adopted the CBSE syllabus in 2008-2009 and is affiliated to CBSE, New Delhi. The first batch of class X CBSE students appeared for the final examination in March 2013.

2. AIM OF THE SCHOOL

N.I.T.K. English Medium School provides liberal, national and essentially Indian Education conducive to inculcate in the pupils a spirit of patriotism, democratic outlook, a sense of duty and discipline. Education imparted in the school generally prepares the students to play the role of well disciplined citizen of our great nation with an all round developed personality.

3. FACULTY

Our faculty consists of a dedicated team of trained post graduates and graduates. They have contributed to the achievement of high academic standard and have always made this institution worthy of recognition in the field of education in Karnataka.

FEE REGULATIONS

1. Students have to pay tuition fees & special fees in 3 installments (Term fees) payable in May, September and January.
2. A student will not be allowed to appear for the Annual Examination if he/she has not paid all the fees and dues before the commencement of the examination.
3. It will be very much appreciated if the fees for the whole year is paid in a single installment in the beginning of the year.

SCHOOL RULES

School discipline is necessary to achieve self-direction. The school rules help to strengthen the student's determination for growth and self improvement.

1. Attendance of the opening and closing day of every term is compulsory.
2. The student must be in School before the first bell at 8.25 a.m. Late attendance or absent record should be signed by the parents of the late comers and absentees. Three late arrival will be considered as 1/2 day leave.
3. Students are not allowed to colour their hair, grow or polish their nails, use mehendi or tattoos.
4. Students are solely responsible for their belongings, books, writing materials, tiffin boxes etc.
5. It is forbidden to write or scribble on the walls, tables etc., throw paper or ink in the classroom or in any way damage the school property.
6. The School cannot be responsible for any accidents, small or serious to the pupils during school hours or excursions.
7. Parents are not allowed to visit the class room during class hours. Students are not allowed to see parents, visitors or leave the school premises during school hours without the permission of the Principal.
8. Leave of absence is not granted except on prior written application from parents (except in cases of unforeseen circumstances) and only for serious reasons.
9. Every pupil must take part in school games and other activities unless declared physically unfit or exempted by the Principal.
10. Results declared at the end of the year are final in all cases and they will not be reconsidered.
11. No pupil who fails for two years in succession will be kept in the school.
12. School authorities will deal only with the parents regarding the child's progress. No other persons will be entertained.

RULES AND REGULATIONS TO THE PUPIL

1. Students are not allowed to enter the classroom other than their own.
2. Attendance for all tests and examinations is compulsory. A student can be exempted from writing exam only on medical reasons and in such case a Medical Certificate has to be produced.
3. If student has his/her absence exceeding three days, then a letter must be forwarded to the Principal through the Class Teacher with valid reasons.
4. The Principal reserves the right to dismiss such students who continue to be indisciplined despite repeated warnings.
5. Any letter to students addressed to the School are subject to scrutiny by the School Authority.
6. Attendance during classes and examinations, progress as well as conduct of the students will be taken into consideration while recommending the students for merit certificates.
7. No pupil is permitted to wear any jewellery in the school. Such students will do so at their own risk and the school shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage.
8. No one can leave the school premises during school hours without the permission of the Principal. Students will not be sent home during class hours on their own.
9. Students are responsible to the school authorities for their conduct both inside and outside the school. Shouting, whistling, speaking abusive language, running in the school building, insulting or throwing things at one another and disobeying etc are strictly forbidden.
10. No student is permitted to use the blackboard except when called for by teachers.
11. Every student must keep the floor and surroundings clean.
12. All boys have to wear only formal wear for any school function.
13. Girl students are required to wear dignified and decent garments. Sleeveless outfits are not permitted.
14. Uniforms should be spic and span, neatly ironed.

15. Students may be required to take part in various co-curricular and extra-curricular activities even outside school hours. When required, participation will be deemed compulsory.
16. Staying away from mandatory school functions including Annual Day and Sports Day without prior permission or justification will be considered as indiscipline by default.
17. The school is not responsible for student going to their friends/relatives house before or after school hours without the permission of their parents.

GENERAL DISCIPLINE

1. Students are requested to behave politely and avoid use of indecent language or actions injurious to the feeling of fellow students, teachers or others in the school.
2. Students are responsible to school authorities for their conduct not only in the school but also for their general behaviour outside. Any report of the student observed objectionable in conduct outside the school will make them liable to disciplinary action. It is expected that through their good behaviour they keep up their dignity and the prestige of the school.
3. Parents and /or students (individually or collectively) are forbidden to give gifts to the teachers. A token gift of flower may be allowed.
4. Neither parties nor presents by students or parents on birthdays of students are allowed. As a birthday contribution, a book to the Library or a plant to the school garden is appreciated.
5. Serious violation of the rules, regulations and the discipline of the school are punishable including removal or expulsion from school. Such action will normally follow with an oral warning for the first violation, written warning for the second violation and expulsion from school for the third violation.

6. Students are not allowed to bring any type of electronic gadgets like mobile, camera, smart watches, i-pads etc., during school time or during occasional trips arranged by school. If a student is found with any type of electronic gadgets, the parent will be held responsible and the student will be suspended.
7. Parents are expected to give adequate time to their children by providing them with a silent place to study, insist on a home work time, free from disturbance, check with teachers when assignments or other instructions are not clear, encourage children to do their best so far as accuracy and neatness are concerned, encourage them to read books at home.
8. English being the medium of instruction in the school, students must communicate in English only.
9. Each student's safety is major concern of the school. Therefore, the following should be strictly observed.
 - a) Parents of every child, including pre-primary are required to teach their children their names, important mobile numbers and address.
 - b) It is the parent's responsibility to arrange for the pick and drop of their child at school and ensure that the child reaches home safely.
10. Parents are encouraged to have their children undergo medical examination regularly for well being, especially dental, eye and ear care.

LIBRARY RULES

Books are Food for Thought. Enjoy reading them.

1. All students are members of the School Library.
2. Strict silence and order must be maintained in the library.
3. Only two books will be issued at a time and can be kept for two weeks.

4. Books will be issued to the students of Std III and above, during the library periods and not in any teaching periods.
5. Books should be properly maintained and deposited on the due date.
6. Marking, underlining, cutting and erasing or tearing pages of the books are strictly prohibited and liable to be punished.
7. All Magazines, Reference books, Journals and Periodicals are to be read in the Library.
8. Students are not allowed to exchange books and borrower cards among themselves.
9. While returning the book 'Borrowers card' must be collected.
10. A fine of Rs. 10/- for one day late and thereafter Rs.5/- per day will be collected for the books returned after the due date.
11. Fine will be charged for damages done to the books and articles in the library, starting from a minimum of Rs.10/- to the cost of the books or articles.
12. If the Borrower Card is lost, Rs.25/- must be paid for a duplicate card.
13. Books lost must be replaced by the borrower within a fortnight or the cost of the book must be paid as fine. Therefore, the student will be held irresponsible and no books will be issued to the particular student.

CODE OF CONDUCT

We work to foster an environment in which the needs, rights and responsibilities of individuals and groups are respected. We are proud of the courteous behaviour of our students and staff.

At NITK, students enjoy the right to:

- A safe and secure learning environment, free from physical or emotional abuse from any member of the school community.
- Open and consistent feedback from the class teacher
- Obtain extra help from a subject teacher at a mutually convenient time.

- Express themselves within the bounds of acceptable social behaviour.
- Be fully informed of school rules and to be held accountable for any inappropriate actions.
- Grieve any infringement of a student's rights.

Each student is expected to:

- Act courteously and respect the rights of others.
- Respect personal belongings, belongings of others and school property.
- Practice safe play and play with others in a positive and constructive way.
- Use appropriate language.
- Act with honesty and integrity.
- Attend classes, activities and events punctually and regularly.
- Work diligently and co-operatively.
- Respect the culture and customs of people of all backgrounds.
- Identify and use positive ways to deal with disagreements and conflicts.
- Learn an additional language or languages.
- Make good choices.
- Find opportunities to extend their friendships.
- Respect the rights of individuals and groups and treat others in a fair and considerate way.
- Show respect and courtesy to staff and peers.
- Be responsible for their own self discipline whilst on school property, school buses and during out door school activities that are part of the school programme.

- Adhere to school policies regarding harassment, violence, drugs, alcohol, tobacco etc.

If a student has difficulty in meeting these expectations, he/she will meet a member of the teaching staff and/or the Principal or Vice Principal. The student will review expectations for appropriate behavior, develop an action plan, and may be asked to fulfill appropriate consequences. If the incident is more serious, the student's parents will be contacted.

CLEANLINESS

1. It is healthy for every student to have a good bath in the morning and eat good breakfast to be active and energetic in the school throughout the day.
2. Students must come to school in neat and well dressed school uniform, well groomed hair, nails trimmed and polished shoes.
3. It is the duty of all the students to keep their classrooms and other places in and around school clean and in order. Parents have to follow cleanliness and keep the surrounding clean and teach the same to their children. They should cultivate the habit of using the dustbin. Stop littering the environment and make India "Swacch Bharath".
4. Parents should not bring eatables in plastic or paper wrappers and litter the NITK Campus or school surroundings.

SCHOOL PROPERTY

1. Students shall co-operate with the library, computer and laboratory centre staff, in maintaining order and discipline. Students shall take care not to lose, damage or deface any of the materials, fixtures and equipment that are provided.
2. Damage done even by accident to any school property should be reported at once to the class teacher or the Principal.

Any damage done should be replaced by the one who has done it. In the event of any damage of electrical or computer systems in the class or school, the cost/fine will be charged and recovered from the student/students causing the damage to the system provided in the classroom.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO STUDENTS

1. Never omit the lesson or home work assigned.
2. Always revise the work done in class and make sure that you have understood everything clearly and thoroughly.
3. If memory work is assigned, learn it overnight and repeat it as the first thing in the morning.
4. Always take down in your diary, the work that is assigned for the next day.
5. All homework should be done neatly and the day's work always dated.
6. As you grow up, make a daily study timetable of different subjects for yourself, arranging them in order of difficulty, the most difficult one being the first. Include time for your rest, recreation etc. This way you will learn to cultivate regular habits, which are the most valuable asset in later life.
7. Revise at the end of the week all that you learnt during the week.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

1. The School is grouped into four squads for the purpose of conducting different activities and Inter-Squad Championship Trophy is awarded to the squad that scores the highest number of points during the academic year.
2. Inter-Squad debates and quiz competitions, talents show, inter squad games, athletic and cultural competitions are the

regular features of the academic year.

3. The School provides ample opportunities for the students to take part in different co-curricular activities and thereby develop qualities of self expression, self confidence, self discipline, purposefulness, endurance and decision making.
4. There will be other activities during the week for students who are in The Bharath Scouts, Guides, Cubs and Bulbuls from Kindergarten level, Std 1 and above.

With a view to develop sense of service, to foster team spirit as well as to encourage a spirit of healthy competition in academic, sports and other curricular activities, each pupil will be awarded points for curricular and extra curricular activities on the basis of Squads. TO PARENTS OR GUARDIANS

1. Parents are not permitted to enter any classroom or talk to the teachers during class hours.
2. Parents may visit class teacher/subject teachers/Principal after filling in the VISITORS ENTRY BOOK available at the office and after the permission from Principal. Direct entry of parents/guardians during the school hours to meet a teacher or student will be considered as violation of rules and strict action will be taken by the school authorities.
3. Parents are advised to provide bus passes to their wards who commute by local buses and avoid giving money as far as possible.
4. Every parent/guardian is a member of the Parent Teacher Association of the School.
5. For promotion, a student must put in 75% attendance.
6. Students are not allowed to change their option of Karate/Dance/Music classes in the mid of the academic year.
7. Students of Std VII and above, are not allowed to change their option of second language.
8. Anonymous letters will not be entertained.
9. Absence of child from class for attending social functions without prior permission is discouraged.
10. Kindly see that your ward attends the school in neat, well pressed school uniform.
11. Parents should make sure that their wards are regular and punctual to school and diligent at their homework and other school activities.
12. Special attention is given to the character formation of the students and discipline of the school.
13. Parents are particularly expected to sign the Principal's and teacher's remarks.
14. Criticism of teachers or school by the parents should be avoided. If you have a legitimate complaint, meet the Principal between 1.30-2.30p.m. only, preferably with a prior appointment over the phone.
